- When a not-for-profit organisation is formed, you have to create bylaws.
- Bylaws set out the rules for governing and operating the organisation. •

Bylaws can be modified as the needs of the organisation change over time.

- Bylaw changes have to be instigated by the Board of Directors and follow a process of consultation with its members.
- Any bylaw changes require EKSC members to agree to the changes through a 75% majority vote at the Annual General Meeting.
- Subject to member majority agreement at an AGM, the bylaw changes are submitted to Alberta Corporate Registry.





Why are we doing this?

- The last time the Club Bylaws were amended was 2013 and the changes at that time were minimal.
- Every year for the past few years, EKSC Board of Directors have suggested the need to review the Club Bylaws but this has never proceeded, due to time pressures and other commitments.
- In January 2020, the EKSC Board approved the terms of reference for a Bylaws Working Group to be convened and to start the review process.
- The Bylaws Working Group comprises of 5 EKSC Members all of whom have volunteered their time, skills and experience to undertake the review and make proposed changes to the existing Bylaws.
- The review has looked at the operational needs of EKSC both now, and in the future; taken best practice from other swim clubs and their bylaws, and also considered Swim Alberta bylaws and their suggested bylaw template for new competitive swim clubs.



Specific scope of the Review

There were 4 specific areas the Bylaws Working Group were asked to consider as part of the review process:

- 1. <u>Bylaw Framework</u>: to consider the adoption of the Swim Alberta bylaws template and if it is/could be applicable to EKSC.
- 2. <u>Board Member tenure and vacancies available</u>: to address areas of concern in the current bylaws which see 6 Board Members having to step down this year and propose revisions which ensure continuity and protection for the Club in the number of Board member vacancies available at any point in time and the tenure they should hold. To also factor in any unforeseen changes to Board members during a 12-month period such that the Club is not exposed to too many vacancies at any point in time and propose interim arrangements should this occur.
- 3. <u>Role tenures and voting rights review</u>: to review the length of tenure required and whether voting rights are awarded for the role of 'past-president' and also the roles of 'associate members'.
- **4.** <u>Updating the Bylaws</u>: to review the existing bylaws and ensure all aspects are updated and applicable to how EKSC currently operates, and flexible enough to support its future strategic direction

- Member 'transfer', 'suspension', 'termination', 'may not resign', 'discipline'

Greater distinction between the various types of members - links to changes in voting rights in a later section

Greater clarity provided in all these instances: mirroring how the Club currently operates

No changes to how this is currently applied through the existing Club policies

Article 5: Meeting of the Members (slide 1 of 2)

5.2 Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM): can be called by the President on receipt of at least 10 voting members requesting an EGM, and of which 7 of whom must be present at the meeting. Can also be initiated by the President on request of the Board of Directors.	Greater clarity to enable EGM's to be initiated by at least 10 members, 7 of whom must be present at the actual meeting. No proxy voting allowed in these instances	Current bylaws are not clear enough, so this is being strengthened If circumstances are such to call an EGM, then those attending are entitled to vote and 'voting by proxy' in these instances will not be allowed
5.5 Quorum: 10% members	Proposal to change this to an absolute Number of members: 21	Current bylaws are not clear as to how 10% is calculated. 21 is easier to administer at either an AGM or EGM, and is currently approx. 10% of paying members 21 is also recommended by Swim Alberta in their bylaw template.

Note: There will be no changes to the Annual General Meeting provisions within the current bylaws.



Members (slide 2 of 2)

Article 5: Meeting of the

Voting:

Every member has one vote and voting by proxy is allowed at all meetings

Athlete Members: 1 vote allowed Honorary Members: 1 vote allowed Affiliate Members: no votes allowed

For clarity: **only 1 vote per 'registered account'** irrelevant of how many athletes may be swimming.

The person entitled to vote, is the one whose name the membership account is registered in Greater clarity provided on who can vote and how many votes per 'family' are allowed.

Detailed section included in proposals will cover the majority of circumstances.

Reasoning is to make it simple to understand and easy to apply.

Proxy voting has been removed from EGM's (see earlier notes)

6.1 Powers Details the powers that the Board of Directors have in carrying out their duties on behalf of the Club. 6.3 Qualification of Directors & Removal Refers to 'qualification' as being a voting member of the Society. Largely focuses on how a Director can be removed. 6.2 Number of DirectorsCan only be elected at an AGM.

No less than 6, and no more than 8 to be elected to the Board for 2 years tenure, and max of 3 consecutive terms

The Board may appoint a further 4 directors for a specific reason only up to the next AGM

Any Board vacancy arising, should be promptly filled as soon as possible by an

Board Members can be elected at either an **AGM or EGM** called for that purpose

No change to number (between 6 - 8), term (2 yrs) or consecutive terms allowed (3) BUT elected Directors will hold office until new appointees have been elected

Additional section added for where there are more than half the members of the Board standing down in any year: 'one half the director to be elected shall be for a 1 year term and one half the director to be elected shall be for a 2-year term, with those receiving the most votes

Provides greater flexibility for when Directors can be elected

Ensures greater continuity and stability should there be a delay in appointing individuals to the Board for whatever reason by the current Directors staying in their roles until this is completed

Provides continuity and stability should the Club have the majority of the Board changing in a 12 month period (as is the case in 2020) and attempts to re-set the tenures to ensure consistency in future years

Duty of Directors:Not specified in current bylaws - new section

6.5 Duty of Directors Section taken and inserted from Swim Alberta bylaw template: role of BoD is to make strategic & operational decisions so Club meets statutory & bylaw obligations. Role of a director is to act as a fiduciary to the Club, inform themselves, participate in Board meetings and act in the best interests of the Club

Provides clarity in the role of the Board and also each individual Director appointed to the Board and what they are there to do

Conflicts of Interest: Not specified in current bylaws - new section	6.6 Conflicts of Interest Section taken and inserted from Swim Alberta bylaw template: requests individuals to declare any such instances and remove themselves from the debate	Good governance and control in specifying what needs to happen should there by any perceived conflict of interest

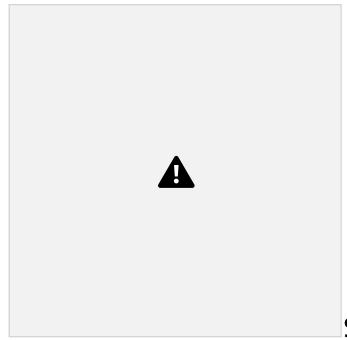

A summary of the key changes in the proposed Club Bylaws

are:

Election of Directors & their tenure

- No change to number (between 6 8), term (2 yrs) or consecutive terms allowed (3) BUT elected Directors will hold office until new appointees have been elected
- Where there are more than half the members of

the Board standing down in any year: 'one half the director to be elected shall be for a 1 year term and one half the director to be elected shall be for a 2-year term, with those receiving the most votes holding office for 2 years'.

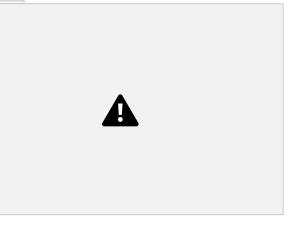
President • Additional points for consideration added in appointing an individual to the role of President

Past-President • Shall be for 1 year only upon the appointment of a new President with no voting rights (unless individual has been elected onto the Board)

- - Role of 18 Committees

- · Clarity in what being a 'member' means
- What makes a Member eligible for election to the Board of Directors • Duties of Directors
- Conflicts of Interest
